

Away Show Needs

Per Horse:

- Feed bucket
- 2 water buckets
- Hay net
- Fans & extension cords
- 4+ bags of shavings per weekend show
- 1-2 bales of hay per weekend
- Feed
- Electrolytes, salt licks
- Breakaway halter & lead
- Sneezy & cooler
- Tail bag or vet wrap

Office/Technical Items:

I recommend reading over the GVHS rulebook for any classes you are participating in.

- GVHS card
- Registration papers
- Health certificates
- Coggins & shot records
- Stall card to write emergency contact (typically provided)
- Tail ribbons for kickers, stallions...

Personal Considerations:

- Rain coat & boots
- Sweatshirts, jackets, scarves, gloves, HotHands
- Schooling outfits & non-show saddle pads
- Horse bathing clothes
- Clothes to cover your show clothes- bigger sweatpants/sweatshirt
- Chargers!
- Medications



Trailer/LQ:

- Extra mattress
- Sheets & blankets
- Pillows
- Towels
- Vacuum trailer & wipe counters
- Barn & trailer cooler
- Coffee, water, tea, snacks
- Horse H2O jugs for travel
- Flip flops & shower bag

Tack Stall:

- SGG set up, GVHS magazines, chairs, tables, table cloths, photos
- Tack cleaning kit- saddle soap, oil/conditioner, towels
- First aid kit- Bute, Banamine, Ace, vet wrap, thermometer, stethoscope, needles & syringes, Bluekote, ointment
- Hardware kit- bungees, string, duct tape, scissors, hole punch, zipties
- Grooming kit- Posture Prep/curry, hard brush, soft brush, mane & tail brush, hoof pick, fly spray
- Bathing bucket- shampoo, conditioner, coat shine, quick bath, purple shampoo, mane & tail brush, bands, cornstarch, spray paint, water spray bottle
- Portable heater wash if horses not bathed prior to arrival
- Hooks
- Saddle rack
- Clothes rack
- Longe line, whip
- Dressage whip
- Wheelbarrow, pick, broom
- Lock & chain

Halter Classes:

If you are showing multiple horses, I recommend having a coat for each number and you switch out.

- Helmet/cowgirl hat (optional but preferred, HELMET IF HANDLING YOUNG HORSE)
- Coat/blazer
- Button down shirt and jeans/slacks, collared & sleeved English shirt with breeches/slacks
- Stocktie (optional)
- Belt
- Boots & socks
- Gloves (optional)
- Number pins or magnets
- Halter if in western attire or if horse under 2 years old with leather lead
- Bridle if in english attire and horse is over 2 years old
- 4' whip allowed, NO SPURS

English Riding Classes:

Discuss attire with me if you're signed up for hunter under saddle classes.

- Helmet
- Coat
- Show shirt
- Breeches
- Stocktie (optional)
- Belt
- Gloves (optional)
- Boots & socks- paddock boots with jodhpur straps or half chaps OR tall boots
- Bridle
- Saddle
- Girth
- Saddle pads- square pads definitely, possibly hunt pad and half pad

Western Riding Classes:

- Helmet if youth or cowgirl hat
- Button down shirt
- Jeans
- Boots & socks, possibly full chaps
- Belt
- Bridle
- Saddle
- Girth
- Saddle pads
